















Introduction:

The NAFS project is one of the initiatives undertaken by the Education and Training Evaluation Commission «ETEC», implemented by the National Center of Assessment (Qiyas) in collaboration with the Ministry of Education. This project focuses on the best global assessment practices for educational systems while considering the characteristics of the general education in the Kingdom. It aims to achieve the goals of the Commission, meet the expectations of society and wise leadership, in enhancing general education and increase its contribution to the economic development.

The National Assessments are standardized tests that comprehensively assess students academic achievement based on curriculum standards. They aim to determine students knowledge and skills in specific subjects and track educational changes over time at the national level. The results of these assessments are utilized in making educational decisions and improving the educational process in actual classroom settings. Additionally, the assessment results provide credible information and data for educational researchers to make use of in scientific research aimed at enhancing the educational process.

Implementation Mechanism of the Paper-based Assessment on the Target Group

The assessments are administered in-person at all schools in paper-based format. ETEC is responsible for preparing and printing the assessment questions. A total of (3) models are being administered each day to cover the curriculum in mathematics, reading, and science for the specific grade. Trained teams from the ETEC, in coordination with the Ministry of Education, oversee the administration process.

ETEC schedules the assessment dates for each school in coordination with the education departments. On the day of administration, the assessment administrator goes to the designated school according to the timetable, with the assessment materials, which include question booklets and answer sheets.

All assessment questions are multiple-choice. The student reads the question and the answer choices in the booklet, then shades the circle corresponding to the correct answer on the answer sheet. Each student is provided with a printed booklet, and answer sheet with their name on it to record their answers.

The assessment consists of (31) questions for the third grade and (55) questions for the sixth and ninth grades. The test takes around 2.5 hours.

After completing the assessment questions, the student answers the survey, which covers teaching methods and some social and economic aspects that may impact the student's academic achievement. In addition to the student survey, there are electronic surveys for parents, the school principal, and subject teachers involved in the assessment. All these surveys help identify factors that influence students' educational achievement. The login link for these surveys will be sent to the school management for distribution to the relevant individuals.







3.1 Contents of NAFS Booklet:

The assessment is presented in a paper booklet that includes the questions from all three sections (Reading, Mathematics, and Science) for the sixth and ninth grades. However, the third-grade booklet contains only two sections; reading and mathematics. In addition to the student survey, the components of the student booklet are as follows:

- Booklet Cover: It includes the name of the assessment and grade level with the student's name printed.
- Section 1 Page: It indicates the number of questions in this section and provides instructional guidance for the assessment takers.
- 3. Section 1 Questions.
- 4. Break page between sections.
- Section 2 Page: It indicates the number of questions in this section and provides instructional guidance for the assessment takers.
- 6. Section 2 Questions.

- 7. Break page between sections.
- 8. Section 3 Page: It indicates the number of questions in this section and provides instructional guidance for the assessment takers.
- 9. Section 3 Questions, applicable only to third-grade and ninth-grade students.
- 10.Instructional page on how to complete the student survey.
- 11. Survey
- 12. Back Cover.








3.2 Answer Sheet:

The answer sheet consists of a single sheet of A4 paper, printed on both sides. The front side contains pre-printed student and school data, including a barcode for these data, as well as shaded circles for marking the answers to the assessment questions, as illustrated below.

The back side contains shaded circles for marking the answers to the student survey.











Instructions inside the Assessment Hall:

First: Instructions before distributing the booklets

- 1. Encourage students to approach the assessment with seriousness and emphasize the significance of answering accurately.
- 2. It is strictly prohibited to use mobile phones, calculators, or watches that function as calculators.
- 3. It is strictly prohibited to open textbooks, notebooks, or study materials inside the hall.
- 4. Students should only use pencils that will be distributed before the assessment. The use of ballpoint pens, both gel and ink, is strictly prohibited.
- 5. The assessment consists of two sections for the third grade, and three sections for the sixth and ninth grades. Each section has a designated time limit as follows:

- 6. Pencils are distributed to the students.
- 7. Answer sheets are distributed to the students. Each student is given the sheet that corresponds to them, printed with their name, and they do not need to write down data of their civil ID and school code.
- 8. If a student is provided with a booklet that does not have their information printed thereon, the student shall be required to fill in their complete information on both the booklet cover and the answer sheet.


Second: Instructions when distributing assessment booklets

- 1. The assessment questions with answer choices are printed in the assessment booklet. Shade the circle of the correct answer on the answer sheet. You can use the assessment booklet as a draft to work out your answers.
- 2. Fully shade the circle of the correct answer and shade only one circle per question (the proctor will explain the shading method and demonstrate it on the board).

- 3. The proctor will monitor the students> progress and ensure that their answers are recorded on the answer sheet.
 - It is strictly prohibited to look at the assessment booklets or read any part of the student's questions, neither by the proctor nor by any school staff.
- 4. After completing the assessment sections, the proctor will provide instructions to the students on how to complete the survey, and if needed, the proctor may read the survey questions to them.

Implementation Mechanism of the Computer-based Assessment on the Target Group

The computer-based test will be implemented concurrently with the paper-based test on a sample of schools during the same implementation period. The available computer devices in the schools will be utilized. The following are some procedures related to the digital implementation:

• Instructions Before Taking the Assessment

- 1. Encourage students to approach the assessment with seriousness and emphasize the significance of answering accurately.
- 2. It is strictly prohibited to use mobile phones.
- 3. Student can use a draft paper to try out their answers, which will be handed to the proctor after the assessment.
- 4. It is strictly prohibited to open textbooks, notebooks, or study materials inside the hall.
- 5. The assessment consists of two sections for the third grade, and three sections for the sixth and ninth grades. Each section has a designated time limit as follows:

How to Access the Test Platform

 The school management should prepare the computer devices on the day of the assessment and open the homepage of the assessment platform as shown in the image below.



The proctor opens the assessment page for the student as shown in the image below. They will then proceed to review the assessment instructions by clicking on the "Start Test" button.












After completing all the questions, a summary page will appear showing you all the questions and the status of each question. After reviewing your answers, click on "Submit Answers and Finish Section" to submit your responses. Additionally, you can return to the unanswered questions by clicking on "Return to Section."



After reviewing your answers and clicking on «Submit Answers and Finish Section,» a confirmation message will appear, indicating the completion of the section. By clicking on «Submit Answers and Finish Section,» you will not be able to return to the questions.



- After confirming the completion of the section and submitting your answers, the page will transition to the «NAFS Survey.» You should answer the survey questions related to the test and its content.


